30 January – The King and I (Musical, 1956)

Anna, a widow, and her son travel to Bangkok, where she has been assigned as a teacher to King Mongkut's children. She soon finds herself having cultural clashes and differences with the King. Starring Yul Brynner & Deborah Kerr

27 February – A Haunting in Venice (Mystery, 2023)

In post-World War II Venice, Hercule Poirot, now retired and living in his own exile, reluctantly attends a seance. But when one of the guests is murdered, it is up to the former detective to once again uncover the killer. Starring Kenneth Branagh

26 March – Judy (Drama, 2019)

Winter 1968 and showbiz legend Judy Garland arrives in London to perform in a sell-out run at The Talk of the Town. It is 30 years since she shot to global stardom in The Wizard Of Oz, but if her voice has weakened, its dramatic intensity has only grown. Starring Renee Zellweger

23 April – The Unlikely Pilgrimage of Harold Fry (Comedy Drama, 2023)

When Harold learns his friend Queenie is dying, he is moved to act. He leaves home, walking to the post box to send her a letter, until he realises a letter is not enough. In that moment Harold decides to keep walking, all the way to her hospice. Starring Jim Broadbent & Penelope Wilton

21 May – Sunset Boulevard (Classic Drama, 1950)

In one of Hollywood's best films, an out-of-work screenwriter attaches himself to a tragically deluded screen star attempting a comeback. The winner of 3 Academy Awards. Starring William Holden & Gloria Swanson

11 June – The Great Escaper (Drama 2023)

In the summer of 2014, Bernard Jordan made global headlines. He had staged a "great escape" from his care home to join fellow war veterans on a beach in Normandy, commemorating their fallen comrades at the D-Day Landings 70th anniversary. Starring Michael Caine & Glenda Jackson

16 July – Summer Holiday (Musical 1962)
